Under the American Rescue Plan, the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) issued you 2021 Economic Impact Payment(s) for the following total amount:

What do you need to do?

This Economic Impact Payment isn't considered taxable income, and you shouldn't report it as income on your 2021 federal income tax return. However, you'll need the total payment amount shown above to determine whether you're eligible to claim the Recovery Rebate Credit on your 2021 federal income tax return.

If you think you didn't receive the full amount of the third Economic Impact Payment you were entitled to, you must file a 2021 federal income tax return to claim the Recovery Rebate Credit, even if you aren't otherwise required to file a tax return.

Possible Federal Tax Refund Due to the Earned Income Credit (EIC)

What Is the EIC?

The EIC is a refundable tax credit for certain workers.

What Is the Purpose of This Notice?

Your employer sent you this notice to make you aware of an important federal tax benefit. Even if you had no income tax withheld from your wages during the year, you may be eligible for the EIC.

How Much Is the EIC?

For 2021, the EIC can be as much as \$3,618 if you have one qualifying child who has a valid SSN; \$5,980 if you have two qualifying children who have valid SSNs; \$6,728 if you have three or more qualifying children who have valid SSNs; and \$1,502 if you have no qualifying children who have a valid SSN.

How Do You Claim the EIC?

To claim the EIC, you must:

1. Be eligible for the EIC, and
2. File a 2021 tax return (including Schedule EIC if you have a qualifying child).

To figure out if you are eligible, see Pub. 596 or visit [IRS.gov/EITC](https://www.irs.gov/EITC).

If eligible, you can claim the EIC to get a refund even if you had no tax withheld from your pay or owe no tax. For example, if you had no tax withheld in 2021 and owe no tax but are eligible for a credit of \$800, you must file a 2021 income tax return to get the \$800 refund.

Most people qualify for free tax preparation. If you earned less than \$72,000, you can file for free online at [IRS.gov/FreeFile](https://www.irs.gov/FreeFile). In addition, IRS-certified volunteers can prepare your return for free in person if you earned less than \$58,000 or are age 60 or older.
