IMPORTANT TAX DOCUMENT - INFORMATION ONLY -

Below is a statement from the Ohio Department of Taxation (ODT) that shows the amount of your overpayment during 2017.

Note: Box #2 shows the total overpayment calculated on your return before any reductions for donations or for payment of use tax. For example, if your refund check was for \$400 and your return shows that you donated \$20 to Ohio's wildlife fund and paid \$35 of use tax, the amount shown in box #2 would be \$455, which is your overpayment before any deductions.

NEW FOR TAX YEAR 2018

Effective for tax year 2018, ODT will no longer mail 1099-G forms to taxpayers, however, the 1099-G will still be available to retrieve electronically by going to **tax.ohio.gov**. See retrieval instructions on the reverse side.

Additional Information on 1099-G

Why did I get a 1099-G?

- The United States Internal Revenue Code (6050E) requires that all refunds, credits or offsets received in 2017 be reported to you on form 1099-G.
- The IRS notifies us each year which Ohio taxpayers should be issued a 1099-G.

What do I do with the 1099-G?

You <u>may</u> have to claim it as income on the federal return. The total amount shown may be taxable to you if you listed the
Ohio tax paid as an itemized deduction on your previous year federal income tax return. The 1099-G does <u>not</u> take into
consideration any taxes paid within the same year.

How to Retrieve your Electronic 1099-G/1099-INT

Go to **tax.ohio.gov** to electronically retrieve your 1099-G and 1099-INT document. By going to the Online Services portion of our website, you will be able to enter your consent electronically via our taxpayer profile portal by creating a user name and password through our secure site for the following self-help services:

- Electronically view your 1099-G and/or 1099-INT form(s)
- Update your profile to include:

Once you have completed this information and we verify your identity, you will be able to obtain your 1099-G through our I-File application.
